### **Appointment process**

Regional Leads for EPM UK (RLs) are appointed by the EPM UK team under the auspices of the Faculty of Pain Medicine Training and Assessment Committee (FPMTAC). Generally, there is one RL for each School of Anaesthesia. The appointment will be reviewed every three years by EPM UK under the auspices of the FPM Training and Assessment Committee (FPMTAC).

All applications should be submitted to the FPM via the email address above by the stipulated closing date. Applications received after this date will **not** be eligible for the selection process.

If there is more than one applicant, a ballot will be held amongst EPM UK and FPMTAC, coordinated by the FPM secretariat. A simple majority will suffice and in the event of equality of votes, the Chair of the EPM UK under the auspices of FPMTAC will have a casting vote (which he or she can delegate). Appointments are made subjection to ratification by the Board of the Faculty.
